

Dec. 11, 1967

The Board of Election Supervisors held its regular monthly meeting at the office on Dec. 11, 1967 at 3:30 P.M.

The minutes were read and approved.

Under old business, it was reported that the map that is to be sent to the Secretary of State will be purchased from the Map Dept. for \$1.50 and will be sent before Jan. 1, 1968.

Discussion followed concerning the removal of those 200 persons that have voted in a City Election, but not in a state or national election in the past 5 years. Mr. Kaylor advised the Board that he had talked to Mr. Boubnitz, the attorney for the City and our attorney, Mr. Hauver and it was decided to send the cards to these people telling them they are not eligible to vote in future state and national elections. However, they are still eligible for City Elections and will have to be kept separate and put back in the books when a City Election is held.

The question on what to do with those Pinesburg residents that did not send back their transfers was tabled until the next meeting.

A copy of the Loyalty Oath that must be signed by the Poll Workers was given to Mr. Hauver for further study as the U. S. Supreme Court has declared the loyalty oath for public employees unconstitutional.

A letter was received from the National Committee for an Effective Congress requesting many figures of the past elections and also requesting maps and registration figures, as they are gathering data for an election night analysis. We will work on these figures for them and charge them accordingly for the time consumed in preparation of same.

The meeting was adjourned and followed by a Christmas Party.
