The meeting was called to order by President Bartles at 2:30 P.M. at the Washington County Office Building, Hagerstown, Maryland, on September 6, 1978

The Proceedings of the preceding meeting held on August 7, 1978, were read and on motion by Mr. Corderman and Mr. Downey were approved as read. Motion carried.

Under reports not relating to regular business, the Board was advised of the death of Mr. Banzhoff's wife. A card will be sent to Mr. Banzhoff from the Board and the Staff.

Under communications, copies of correspondence since our last meeting were distributed to Mr. Corderman and Mr. Downey.

Under unfinished business the President advised the Board that the polling place for Dist. 17-1 will be the Washington County Free Library - rear entrance, and in Dist. 5 we will be using the Hancock Fire Hall.

Under new business the President distributed the work schedule for Primary Day, Sept. 12, and the work schedule for counting absentee ballots, canvassing machines and tallying records.

Kenneth Long advised the Board that the committee obtaining signatures on petitions for the City Councilmen to run at large had asked permission to be at the polling places to obtain signatures. After discussion, there was a motion by Mr. Downey and Mr. Corderman that the Board not allow the solicitation of names on any petition within 100 feet of the polling places. Motion carried.

The Board discussed the wearing of T-shirts containing candidates' names into the polling places. It was decided that this is the same as campaign literature and we must follow the election law that states no campaigning within 100 feet of the polling place.

The President advised that the printing order for the General election will be given to all printers in Washington County to bid on. The

machine custodians will be present when the printing order is given to the printer.

Motion by Downey and Corderman that the meeting be adjourned. Motion carried.
