

Sept. 27, 1968

The Board of Election Supervisors met at the Courthouse on Sept. 27, 1968 at 3:30 P.M.

The following members were present:

The minutes were read and approved.

Under old business the Board discussed the possibility of using Antietam St. School to vote. They called Mr. Parsley and he said he would call the Board of Education to let the lights and heat on, so we can use it on Nov. 5.

The Board also discussed the crowded conditions at the Roads Dept. and Mr. Kaylor reported that he has talked to Mr. Bowser and that he had promised to do something about this. He will contact Mr. Bowser again on this.

The Board discussed if they will use a voting machine per each 400 voters. Mr. McCauley made a motion to table this until the next meeting. Seconded by Mr. Long.

Board discussed the books that might have to be split. Dist. 18-1, Dist. 26 and Dist. 21-2 are the ones that are getting the fullest. The Board will decide at the next meeting if any of these will have to be split.

Board has had some complaints on several Poll Workers. Board members will take care of these complaints.

We discussed the new 45 day Uniform voting act. We must keep out in a separate file those persons who are registered here and are voting in other states under this new Act. Also we will have to order envelopes to comply with a provision of this act.

Mr. Kaylor advised the Board that the Herald-Mail wants to come in and go thru the books and get 300 names to do a survey. Board decided to let them start on Monday night.

We will have to order new absentee ballot envelopes. These will be updated before being ordered.

Mr. Kaylor read a letter of resignation from Mary Stahl, that she will resign as of Nov. 1, 1968. The Board accepted with regrets her resignation. Pat McCauley will work in her place until a permanent appointment is made.

Meeting adjourned.
