A meeting was held by the Board of Election Supervisors at the office of the Board, 24 Summit Ave., on Tuesday, Sept. 5, 1961 at 10 A.M.

A letter was received from the Co. Commissioners dated 8/9/61 authorizing the Board of Election Supervisors to order 5 Voting Machines from Automatic Voting Machine Corp., quoted price of \$1640.00, to be delivered not later than 2/28/62. The contract forms were received which were sent to the Co. Commissioners for signatures, and then same to be forwarded to Automatic Voting Machine Corp.

The Board was given permission by Charles Downey, Co. Commissioner, to have the rooms and front of the building painted at 103 S. Potomac St., the new office of the Board of Election Supervisors.

The Board decided to have our Attorney, Mr. Sweeney, call Mr. Snavelly asking for a letter that we may use the building at the Fairground for the Primary and General Elections for \$50.00 each.

Also the Board would like an opinion in writing from our Attorney on the following question, "Should a list of registered voters be allowed to be copied from our files for commercial uses"?

A contract was received from Mr. Roessner and was given to the Co. Commissioners for the use of the building at 103 S. Potomac St. for temporary office for Board of Election Supervisors from Sept. 1, 1961 until the new annex is completed and Board has moved in.

The Board also decided to contact the Board of Education in regards to using the White Oak Forest School for the Primary and General Elections

Mr. McCauley and Mr. Hellane are going to Huyett's School to see about using the Building for storing voting Machines.

The meeting was then adjourned.
