

June 5, 1967

Mr. Howard S. Kaylor, Mr. M. Kenneth Long, and Mr. Ralph A. McCauley received their Commissions for a 2 year term as Members of the Board of Election Supervisors and were sworn in at the Office of Clerk of Court on June 5, 1967. Dorothy M. Waters received her Commission as a member of the Permanent Board of Registry and was sworn in on June 5. Mr. Arthur L. Haines and Mr. Woodrow W. Rippeon, substitute members of the Election Board also swore in for a 2 year period.

The new Board then met and organized as follows:

Howard S. Kaylor - President
M. Kenneth Long - Vice-President
Ralph A. McCauley - Secretary

Mr. McCauley appointed Mary F. Stahl, as Democrat Registrar for a 2 year period.

Mr. Kaylor nominated Elwood Hauver as Attorney to the Board. Motion seconded by Mr. Long. Motion passed unanimously. A letter is to be sent to Mr. Dwyer, stating that he has been succeeded by Mr. Hauver and to turn over all unfinished business to Mr. Hauver.

Mrs. Dorothy M. Waters was unanimously appointed Republican Member of the Permanent Board of Registry.

The Board asked that a letter be sent to the County Commissioners advising them of the newly appointed Board Members, removal of the names of the outgoing Board and to advise them of the salary increase from \$600 to \$800 per year for the Board Members.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

It was determined by the past Board that all the voting machines were to be set up and the Chief Judges were to be advised that they wouldn't have to open up all the machines, unless they were needed. The Board was also advised that the two additional telephones had been installed for the Election.

Motion made by Mr. Kaylor and seconded by Mr. McCauley that the 4th Wednesday of each month at 3:30 P.M. be designated as the regular meeting day for the Board. Motion carried.

The Board ruled that it would not be necessary to hire the Assistant Machine Custodians for Election Day. The regular machine custodians will work. Mildred Harbaugh will work the switchboard for Election Day. The Board also approved the hiring of extra girls for preparing the supplies for the Special Election, for Election Day and for Canvass Day.

The Board ruled that Thomas W. Sweeney and David J. Riley be given absentee ballots.

Motion made by Mr. Kaylor and seconded by Mr. Long that the Republicans receive the Registration Books and be in charge for this election. Motion carried with Mr. McCauley voting as being opposed to this.

Mr. Kaylor moved the meeting be adjourned & seconded by Mr. McCauley.
