A new method for registered females who get married in regard to changing their names was discussed. The old method as given to the office by the attorney at that time read:


All registered females who get married are taken off the voting record and must reregister under their new name to be elgible to vote in future elections.

The new method is as follows:

All registered females who get married are sent a letter and form to be signed and returned to our office in two weeks in order to get their names changed. The ones that are not returned to our office are taken off the voting records and must reregister before they are allowed to vote. All letters that are not delivered and all persons who can not be located will be removed.

Mr. Spigler suggested we put an article in the newspaper in regard to the new method of changing names.
