Tammy returns to the Washington County Board of Elections for a fourth term having first been sworn in on 6/6/2011. She has previously served as both Board Secretary and Board Vice

President. Tammy actually began her Elections involvement working as an Election Judge (1998- 2004) and continued as a Chief Judge (2004 – 2010) before being appointed to her first term on the Board. She has completed the Open Meetings Act Training Program in July 2017 and actively participates in Annual MAEO (Maryland Association of Elections Officials) Conferences.

Tammy currently works fulltime at Hospice of Washington County since 2005. Her work experience has included both For Profit and Not For Profit organizations and prefers working with Not For Profits. Other community involvement includes: Graduate Leadership of Chambersburg in 1997, Citation Award recipient for Contribution of Community Life in 1999, active involvement with Habitat for Humanity of Franklin County, Served on the Board of Directors for Habitat for Humanity of Washington County including a position of Secretary of the Board, and is a lifetime member of the Hagerstown Community College Alumni and has served several terms on their Board of Directors including positions as Secretary and President. 
