MINUTES:

The minutes of the last meeting held on May 12, 1992 were approved.

CORRESPONDENCE:

Copies of the letter written to Jim Young, Director of Finance, distributed to Board members. Request was made for approval to add \$2,250.75 to our budget for FY 93 for taxes for machine warehouse.

Jean distributed copies of letter written to Marvin Meyn requesting eligibility list.

Letter and eligibility list from Marvin Meyn given to Board members. Procedure discussed for hiring from list. Marvin will send a sample interview notification. Richard made motion when we receive the notice to send to eligible candidates and interview. Seconded by Jim Mobley.

OLD BUSINESS:

Jean updated Board members on defective absentee ballots. Ed Early Printing Co. aware of the problem. The method of drying will be changed. There should be no problem with getting 50 ballots printed for testing.

At this point of meeting, Mr. Edward Miller was allowed to speak regarding Ross Perot. Mr. Miller questioned Section 7-1 of the Registration and Election Laws of Maryland and wondered if they were going in the right direction for Perot to be elected as President of the United States. What happens if Perot wins in Maryland? He is concerned that should Perot win and law possibly doesn't apply. The Board explained to Mr. Miller that guidelines and instructions would come from SABEL regarding the Perot candidacy.

Jim Mobley reported he did an inventory on the "No Electioneering" signs. There are 76 of the metal yellow signs. Motion made by Jim and seconded by Richard to order 25 "No Electioneering" signs from 20-20 Graphics Co. Jim reported, too, there are four handicap signs on stands with arrows and three cardboard "No Parking" signs.

NEW BUSINESS:

After discussion concerning Circuit Court judge's ruling regarding Talbot County Election Board and our local election office hours, Richard suggested this be pursued at MAEO Meeting, getting input from other counties.

Final plans were made for driving to Turf Valley on Monday, June 29.

Jean distributed copies of correspondence from Gene Raynor for the 1993 Biennial Meeting.

After discussion, Jim motioned and Richard seconded that the office be kept open on June 29, 1992, the day the Board members and staff attend the MAEO Meeting. Jean will notify the part time workers to work that day.

At 3:20 P.M. Richard motioned and Jim seconded to close the meeting.
