

Sept. 16, 1969

The Board of Election Supervisors held its meeting at the Office on Sept., 16, 1969 at 2:00 P.M.

The following members were present:

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Mr. McCauley read a letter from the County Commissioners approving the request for \$8.00 for the Sub. Board Members for attending the Board Meetings.

Mr. McCauley reported we can use the Lincolnshire School for voting, but can not store the machines there.

Mr. Long made a motion we remove the names of the 8 people receiving letters for not changing their addresses. Seconded by Mr. Patterson. Motion carried. We are to send a follow-up letter to these people using the same address as the first letter.

The Sub-Dividing of Halfway was discussed. It was decided we go out to Halfway on Monday, Sept., 22, 1969 to get a complete list of the streets in that District. Mr. Padula's resolution was read and accepted by the Board. A copy will be sent to the Clerk of the Court and the Secretary of State.

The office was authorized to buy three maps, showing the new boundary lines for Halfway District- 26-1 and 26-2, and article for newspaper tabled until next meeting.

Mr. McCauley read a letter from the Datatab Co. requesting a list of registered voters. It was discussed and the Board decided we write the Company a letter telling them we will supply them with a list at $\frac{1}{2}$ ¢ per name with payment in advance.

It was announced to the Board that 2,835 persons will be taken off the books for not voting within five years. The cards for the County names have been addressed and ready for mailing January 2, 1970.

Mr. David Ralph Leatherman and his attorney, Mr. Dwyer appeared before the Board requesting that he be able to retain his old voting place, Wilson, District 23. The Board and Mr. Padula questioned Mr. Leatherman after hearing the case. The case was discussed by the Board. Mr. Patterson made a motion Mr. Leatherman makes his residence at 1705 Virginia Ave., Hagerstown, Md. instead of Wilson. Seconded by Mr. Long. Motion carried.
