

June 22, 1967

The Board of Election Supervisors held its regular monthly meeting at the office on June 22, 1967 at 3:30 P.M.

The following members were present:

Mr. Ralph A. McCauley

The minutes were read and corrected to read that Woodrow Rippeon did not swear in as substitute Board Member as of this date. June 29th will be the deadline for Mr. Rippeon to swear in. The minutes were then approved as read.

Motion made by Mr. Long and seconded by Mr. McCauley that the substitute Board members be invited to sit in on the Board meetings.

The cost of the Special Election of June 13, 1967 was \$11,769.94. The County Commissioners received a check from the Comptroller for \$14,860.60 to cover this cost. The Board members expressed concern as to what the balance of this money will be used for.

In accordance with the County Commissioners' decision to open the offices in the Court House at 8:30 A.M. beginning July 1st, Mr. McCauley made a motion that the Election Board office also open at 8:30 A.M. Motion seconded by Mr. Long. Motion carried.

The Board discussed the type of "Voters Registration Card" that we would have printed to start using on July 1, as proposed in the new Election Laws. The card will contain the Washington County seal. They decided to get a price on 5,000 cards from Rudy & Spong and Hagerstown Bookbinding Co. and to give the order to the lower bidder.

The Board discussed the office procedure report as it had been written and decided to make a copy for the County Commissioners and several copies to keep on file in our office. A copy of the report is attached to these minutes.

The remainder of the bills for the Special Election were signed by the Board.

The Board decided to wait until the next regular meeting to go over the new changes in the election laws.

Motion to adjourn was made by Mr. Long & seconded by Mr. McCauley.
