The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Election Supervisors was held on January 7, 1979, at the Washingtonian Motel.

The meeting was called to order by the President at 4:45 P.M. The following were recorded as present:

Proceedings of the preceding meeting held on December 12, 1978, were read. The President called for additions and corrections. There being none, the minutes were approved as read.

Under communications the President distributed copies of our proposed legislation showing changes as made by the Board of County Commissioners.

After discussion on the proposed legislation, motion by Mr. Downey and seconded by Mr. Corderman that we delete in section 2-7 (f) the last sentence saying "and guards shall be paid \$25 per day for each election day". Motion carried.

The Board will suggest to the Washington County Delegation that section 2-3 (22) be corrected to read that the present salary of the Board be shown as \$1,080 which they are now receiving and that the Delegation give serious consideration that a salary differential between the President of the Board and the other members be established, with a salary increase to be considered.

Under old business the Board discussed the addition error made on election night. The Board thought the tally teams should take the time needed to check their adding machine tapes back with their figures before releasing totals to the press.

The President of the Board will talk to Ed Billhimer of the State Board concerning a cabinet for the new printout binders.

Under new business the President announced that our temporary employees will be paid \$2.90 per hour starting January 1, 1979.

Motion by Mr. Corderman and seconded by Mr. Downey that the Town of Williamsport can use two voting machines for their town election. They will have to pay for moving the machines and having them set up. Motion carried.




Motion by Mr. Corderman and seconded by Mr. Downey that we put in our budget for 1979-80 the following items:
