Paul Ottinger called a meeting to order of the Mayor, Council, City Attorney, City Election Board, County Election Board, Attorney for County Commissioners, Mr Eldridge and the Clerk and Registrar for the County Election Board.

Permanent registration for the city was discussed at some length and a motion was made by Councilman Roy Knight to accept the suggestion of Alsetta Myers to use the method she recommended. The motion was seconded by Councilman Elliott and was unanimous. Mrs Myers suggestion was, as follows. The County change their district and precinct lines to match the city lines. All people living in the city will be on the city election books at the same place for all elections. Once a person is registered he is eligible to vote in all city, national, state and county elections. The County Board of Election Supervisors will hold a meeting to make or move district and precinct lines. The cost of extra help for the changing the books will be paid for by the city. A salary of \$100.00 a month will be paid to the two registrars will be paid by the city for five months and then \$50.00 a month from then on. Everyone now on the county books is eligible to vote in the city elections, persons on the city books but not on the county books must register.
