Election Judge Pay

You may recall from the April newsletter that House Bill 1200 passed, was signed by the governor, and is now Maryland law. As a result, each election judge will earn a minimum of \$250 per day for Early Voting as well as for Election Day. And of course all of you returning judges will receive an additional \$100 per day. Don't forget about the one-time training pay of \$50, up from the previous \$25!

In addition to the pay raise for election judges across the board, Barry Jackson went before the County Commissioners on August 8 to ask that our Chief Judges be compensated at \$300 per day, and it was unanimously approved! By law, every election judge earning more than \$600 in a calendar year will need to be added to the county payroll and have taxes deducted from their pay.

With all returning judges earning \$350 a day plus \$50 for training, and all returning chief judges earning \$400 a day plus \$50 in training, it will only take two election days worked to surpass the \$600 mark and need to be added to the payroll.

Be ready for a little extra paperwork when you attend your training session! More information will be coming in future newsletters.

Early Voting Centers

As we continue to add more voters to the county, we have also expanded our need for additional Early Voting Centers. Whether there will need to be three Early Voting Centers or two for the 2024 elections is still yet to be determined.

The possible and viable locations for Early Voting Centers will be discussed at a public hearing on September 12th.

The public hearing will be held at the Washington County Board of Elections on Virginia Avenue on Tuesday, September 12th at 7pm. The Election Board will hold the vote session for the Early Voting Centers on the following Tuesday, September 19th at 3pm.

Early Voting: May 2-9, 2024 7AM-8PM

Election Day: May 14, 2022 7AM-8PM

2022 Gubernatorial **General Election**

Early Voting: October 24-31, 2024 7AM-8PM

Election Day: November 5, 2022 7AM-8PM The helper may only help the voter by:

- Reading the instructions, ballot content, or the provisional ballot application.
- Marking or casting the ballot, using the ballot marking device or filling out the provisional ballot application as directed by the voter. The helper must mark the ballot as directed by the voter.
- Helpers are **not allowed** to suggest how a voter should vote on any contest.
