Keep in mind, we will need all of our election judges again this year for the Early Voting Centers in October and for Election Day on November 5.

- If you were not already on payroll, there was some paperwork that was to be completed online. The paperwork should have already been emailed out to you. If you did not receive this email or need assistance with the forms please feel free to call the office.
- If you are helping out with the drop boxes this year, you may have noticed some changes. The State has asked that all election judges helping to pick up from the drop boxes have a completed background check that includes fingerprinting. - Due to the heavy volume of calls that we get at the office as we get closer to Election Day, a call center will be handling the calls starting April I, 2024! Please be mindful that if you call the main office number, you will reach the call center and probably spend a lot more time trying to get ahold of the office. getting stuck in the call center.

As an election judge you may be working outside of your precinct on Election Day and need to either vote early or by mail-in ballot! Excerpts from Chapter 4 - People and Activities in the Polling Place

4.3 Challengers and Watchers

Maryland law allows selected individuals to serve as challengers and watchers. Challengers and watchers represent candidates and political parties or can support or oppose ballot issues. Official challengers and watchers are election observers who are allowed to observe all election day activities in the polling place.

To be an official challenger and watcher, a person must have a certificate filled out by any of the following:

- The State Board of Elections
- A local board of elections
- A candidate (including filed write-in candidates)
- A political party
- Any other group of voters supporting or opposing a candidate, principle, or proposition on the ballot.

Training Center Cont'd.

Challengers and watchers have the right to:

- Challenge a voter's identity
- Be in the polling room at least I/2 hour before the polls open, but not less than 30 minutes before the polls open
- Be in the polling room during all the work of closing the polls, but must be inside the polling room before the polls close
- Make a list of registered voters who have voted or individuals who have case provisional ballots. They can take this list outside of the polling place.
- Stand where they can see and hear each voter as the voter checks in to vote.

*If the polling place is very busy, chief judges are allowed to ask challengers and watchers to wait. Chief judges should let challengers and watchers look at the scanning unit or pollbook when the polling place is less busy. Stay tuned for more about Challengers and Watchers next month!
